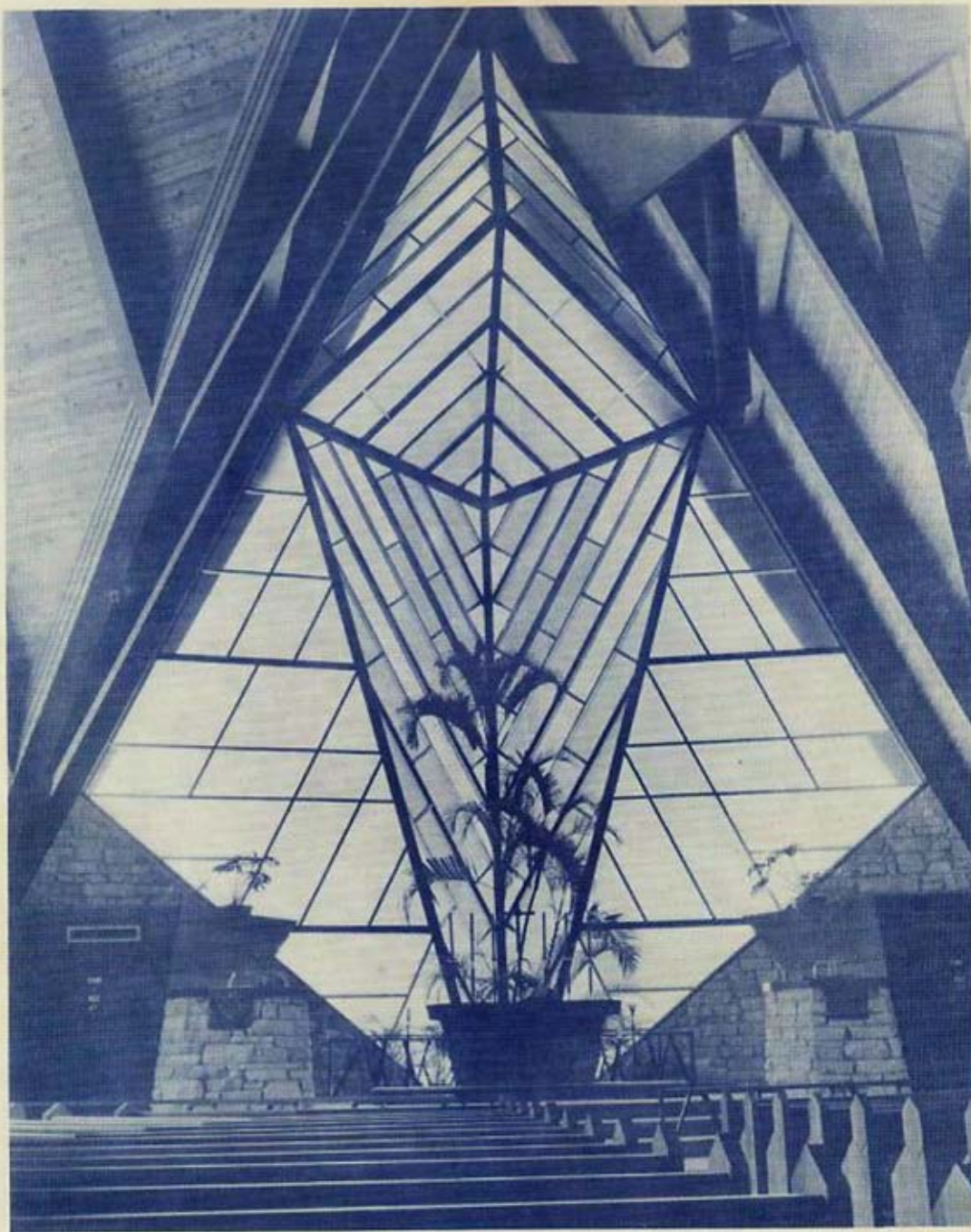

HISTORY OF GRACE LUTHERAN

In September, 1927 the Southern District Mission Board of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod called the Rev. Robert Steinbach as missionary to St. Petersburg for the purpose of canvassing the city; if conditions warranted it, a mission was to be established. Mr. E. C. Gale and other Lutherans who wintered here took the lead in this project.

The first service was held on September 18, 1927 in a small room in the former Masonic Temple at the corner of 4th Street and 2nd Ave., South. When attendance increased and facilities proved inadequate, a fund was started on March 12, 1928 for the purpose of purchasing property. Shortly thereafter two lots on which the former church now stands were bought for \$5,000. The congregation was organized on May 11, 1928 with 19 communicant members, 5 of whom were voting members. On June 24, 1928 ground was broken for the church. The cost of the building was \$18,404.75. First services were held on Nov. 4, 1928. The church was dedicated on Feb. 10, 1929.

Twenty years later, on February 13, 1949 the first floor of the Parish Building was dedicated. The front of this building plus a second story were dedicated on Dec. 17, 1950 (1½ years later). Two building programs within two years! The congregation became self-supporting and had grown to 245 communicant members under the leadership of Pastor Steinbach.

A heart attack suddenly terminated the God-blessed ministry of Pastor Steinbach on April 20, 1955. The congregation was then served by the Rev. Julius Walker as interim pastor until January 21, 1956 when he also was suddenly called Home by the Lord.

On February 19, 1956 Pastor Martin Rupprecht was installed as pastor of Grace Church. During the 5 years of his ministry the congregation increased to 850 communicant members, an increase of 350%. This growth, together with the anticipated continuance of population influx, motivated the Voter's Assembly to relocate and build adequate facilities for our many worshipers and for our Day School and Sunday School children. Our Sunday School also enjoyed a fine growth; a class had to meet in the kitchen; Adult Bible Class had to be discontinued because no room was available. Three Sunday morning services had to be held in "the season" to accommodate our members as well as up to 300 winter visitors per Sunday.

With the able help of Mrs. Rupprecht, the first teacher, a Christian Day School was started in September, 1956. It numbered 18 kindergarten pupils. The following year the first grade was added; enrollment now reached 95 pupils; 2 station wagons were purchased to transport children. In 1959 the 4th grade was added, and our first male teacher, Mr. Walter Wendt, was extended a solemn contract. Mrs. Rupprecht served as acting principal for the first four years. In August, 1960 Mr. Ed Eggersmann arrived as our first Day School principal, having been called from Bethlehem Lutheran School in St. Louis. In addition to his principal duties, Mr. Eggersmann is the teacher of our combined 5th and 6th grades. The present enrollment is 226 pupils. We now have 4 kindergarten teachers and 5 teachers for grades 1 through 6. All of our new classrooms are already filled; in fact, one class is meeting in the library. As time goes on and as God provides the means we shall build additional classrooms and meeting rooms in the two open, uncompleted wings, intended for future expansion.

God has blessed our church and schools. To Him alone be all honor and glory!



OUR NEW CHURCH seats 910. It is air-conditioned. There are 20 S.S. rooms. Our Christian Day School occupies 9 rooms. Our Fellowship Hall seats 300 and dines 300.
