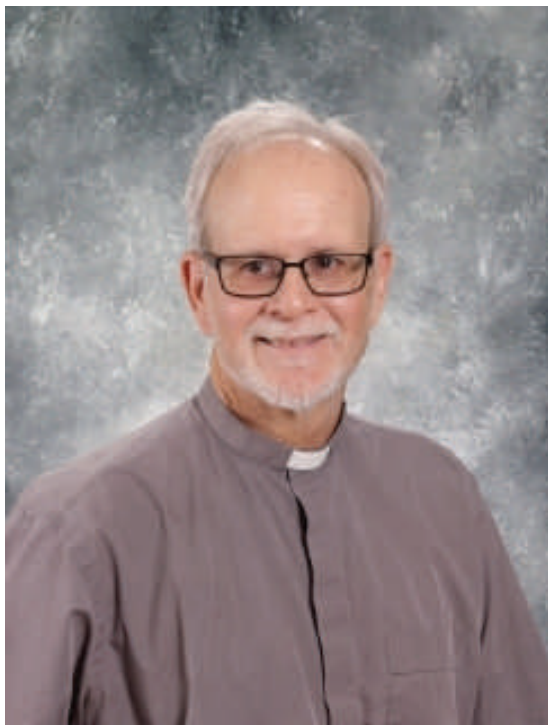

Dear friends in Christ,

This has been a challenging time for anyone in a leadership position of a church/school organization. Since early March, Nicole Clifton, Dr. Diedre Allen, and myself have been hard at work along with other staffers and members of Grace's lay leadership in order to formulate a plan that keeps people safe when they come on our campus whether for school, camp, or services of some sort.

Recently we've categorized our processes and guidelines under what we are calling a PPE plan: Protect, Prevent, and Evolve. At Grace, we seek to protect the health of all congregants, campers, scholars, and staffers on campus. We are constantly at work to prevent the spread of germs and we will continue to evolve based on new data as it becomes available.

There has been a good deal of controversy of late about the data that we are receiving related to the spread of the coronavirus in the Tampa Bay area and throughout the state. The purpose of this column is not to pick or attack a side in that debate, but rather to state that some of the changes we've made at Grace will become permanent and that they are helpful once the current pandemic passes. Each year we have differing strains of flu to contend with. Additionally, there are always members of the Grace community who are forced to stay at home due to health concerns.

Throughout the pandemic we have been offering at least two recorded church services on a weekly basis. These services are being well received by congregants and visitors alike. In fact, they are an outstanding vehicle for you to use in order to "invite" a friend to Grace. What could be less threatening than a video watched in one's own living room?

## **Trying Times**

These are certainly trying times. Our society has shifted to violent lawlessness and destructive name calling. The acts of lawlessness we see are a reminder that our enemy, Satan, and his followers are at work in our country. They are not just working behind the scenes anymore. Certainly, Satan and his fallen angels are doomed, but those humans that seemingly follow him are not yet doomed. While they live, there is still hope for them. Now I am speaking of all those who do not profess Jesus as their Savior, whether outwardly violent or not.

Those that are outwardly rebellious toward God (the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, there is no other) need to know that their actions are wrong. The Ten Commandments were given for this purpose. A person that has pride in their sin or has personally justified their sin to themselves is denying Jesus who died for the very sins they are committing. They have no use for the Gospel as they are happy in their sin.

Our government is set up to protect those abiding by the law. It is also the “hand” of God. This is from St. Paul’s letter to the Romans, chapter 13:1-4:

*“Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. Therefore, whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgement. For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, for he is God’s servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God’s wrath on the wrongdoer.”*

They are commissioned to bring the lawless to justice and punish those who rebel against the laws of the land and the laws of God.

What can we do? Well, we can vote for candidates that profess belief in our God and have a track record of following Him. We can trust that our God loves us and protects us against sin and the attacks of the evil one.

For our part, we can share the love of Jesus to those that don't know Him. I don't think many of those in our country causing or participating in violence or blatantly living in sin have heard about the true Jesus. It is for you and me to learn ways to bring the good news of Salvation to them. Let me share Matthew 10:32, 33:

*“So everyone who acknowledges Me before men, I also will acknowledge before My Father in heaven, but whoever denies Me before men, I also will deny before My Father who is in heaven.”*

Now more than ever, it is time to actively acknowledge Jesus before men. This is done individually, face to face with others. We train ourselves through the diligent reading and study of the Bible. We learn the individual life stories of those around us that don't know Jesus, so we can help them to see what Jesus has done for them. It is hard to acknowledge Jesus to those in need if we are silent.

Maybe we have made most of our friends here at church and don't have much contact with people outside of this circle of friends. We could look for a way to be out in the world, but not of the world, so that opportunities may arise to share the Gospel. In short, look for ways to acknowledge Jesus. It could be as easy as praying in the morning for Jesus to bring you to someone today that needs to hear about Him.

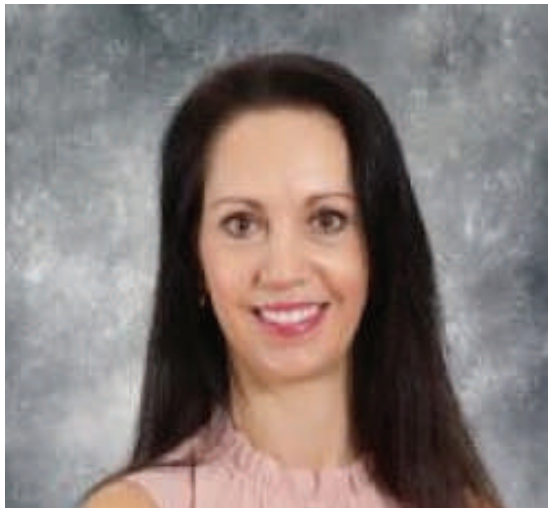

# Stewardship

## The Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod

### LCMS Stewardship Ministry

*“Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might” (Eccl. 9:10)*

God bids us to be faithful in the tasks He calls us to do. He calls us to be members of a family (husbands and wives; fathers and mothers; sons and daughters). He calls us to be members of society (those who govern and those who are governed). And He calls us to be members of His family, the Church (those who preach and teach and those who hear and learn). Each of these callings from God places a duty on us.

As members of a family, husbands are given the duty to die for their wives as Christ gave His life for His bride, the Church; while wives are given the duty to respect their husbands and submit themselves to them as the Church does to Christ. Fathers and mothers are to raise their children in the fear and admonition of the Lord, teaching them the Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord’s Prayer, and the Scriptures concerning Baptism, Confession, the Office of the Keys, and the Lord’s Supper. Children are to honor their parents throughout their lives, and even when their parents are no longer alive, serving and obeying them, loving and cherishing them, and speaking well of them.

As members of society, God calls those who govern to bear the sword, that is, to punish those who do evil (those who live contrary to God’s will) and to reward those who do good (those whose lives are lived in conformity with God’s will). Those who are governed are to obey their leaders as to the Lord Himself, for their leaders bear the sword of God’s temporal justice for a purpose.

As members of God’s own family, the Church, He calls those who preach and teach to do so in faithfulness to His holy Word. To preach and teach the Law of God to convict the hearts of hearers of their sin and to encourage, admonish, and exhort them to do good works in accordance with God’s will. They are to preach and teach the Gospel, the full forgiveness of their sins accomplished by Christ and received through faith, not by works. They are to administer the means of grace in accordance with the Gospel and the Word of God. They do all this for the young and old alike, for those who are near and far off. Those who hear and learn are to submit themselves to their preachers and teachers. They are to support them by their prayers and their gifts.

Each of these callings from God place a duty on us. They make a claim on our presence; on our prayers; and our time, talents, and treasures. So, “whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might” (Eccl. 9:10). Pray for your family, your government, and your church. Give of yourself by means of your time, your talents, and your treasures to your family, your government, and your Church. That is what it means to be faithful in the tasks that God has given us. That is what it means to do it with all your might.

# LWML

Mite Box collections will resume in September. Here are the dates: September 6-7, October 3-4, and November 7-8. Don't forget to wear purple and come to the back of the church to greet everyone.

## **LWML Mission Grants for September, October, and November:**

**September:** \$50,000 promised to Hope and Healing Hub of Downtown Lincoln, Nebraska - University Lutheran Chapel, Lincoln, Nebraska. Research shows that young adults are especially susceptible to depression leading to suicide. Jesus Christ is the greatest hope the church can give a hurting world. The University Lutheran Chapel services students and the surrounding community through worship, Bible studies, and service opportunities. A renovated space will encourage fellowship and new relationships to form and grow while offering Christian counseling services to those who need to hear of God's love for them.

**October:** \$62,650 promised to Pre and Post Seminary Training for local church workers and Mission Training Center in Africa. The Mission Opportunity Project allows our LCMS Area Directors to walk together with church bodies. It will provide means for pastors and other church leaders to receive training to provide pastoral care, to preach in their context, and reach out to their communities as they joyfully share the Gospel.

**November:** \$80,000 promised to Preparing Leaders for Tomorrow. The need for well-trained leaders for our Lutheran Schools is great and increasing. The School Leadership Development Program (SLED) will better equip educators with the tools needed to lead Lutheran schools into the 21st Century. These grant funds will provide training to equip 30 qualified candidates for placement as administrators in LCMS schools who will impact thousand of students, helping them grow as disciples of Christ.

# Trustees

## **Continuing Progress on Campus Care**

WOW! Grace is beginning to look great! Your Grace Lutheran Trustees are very pleased to announce that Summerbreeze has completed the campus roofing, including the Annex, on which they waived the labor charge! New gutters and a French drain have also been installed, and completed, subject to punch out and final walk around.

The painting of the entire exterior of our campus (excluding the gym), was completed by Tom White Painting on June 24. Included in the painting was an additional change order for internal doors, knee walls, and three ceiling beams.

At this time there are funds remaining from the proceeds of the Thrift Store Land Sale, which were voted by the congregation to be used for capital improvements. Trustees are aware of remaining visible, important improvements that need to be taken care of, including the 16th Street parking lot re-pave and new playground surfaces, but we feel that there are other more critical needs at this time.

Currently we are in need of an updated campus-wide intercom system, which may include an upgrade to our telephone system. This is considered as priority and bids are being obtained and until they are in house, we are putting additional spending on hold for now. Also, at this time Grace staff is looking into UV lights to assist with air conditioning and filtering our air. This would be a necessary benefit to everyone on campus.

We are sure that congregants will look at our campus and note additional improvements that still need to be made to beautify and further enhance our curb appeal! It is for this reason we are seeking (and would really appreciate) donations that would enable us to make sure we continue to have the most secure and beautiful campus that we possibly can! Grace is a work in progress!
